Dear Course Director,

Last week, following my memorandum on course attendance, new problems arose. Please consider and pay attention to the rules below:

1. At the Medical School, **lectures are publicly open to attend** for all instructors and (active) students of the UP. Attendance at the lectures can only be restricted by the course director and the lecturer in the following cases:
 - a, Instruction organizational reasons – because of the excess number of interested people, students do not have enough space in the room.
 - b, Ethical reasons, personal rights – e.g. dealing with patients at the clinics (live or by multimedia).
 - c, Due to behaviour disturbing the instruction.

2. **Practices at the Medical School can exclusively be attended** by the students who are **signed up for the course in the ETR**. Reasons for this:
 - a, Practices are expensive (wearing of infrastructure and appliances, using of materials, etc.).
 - b, Due to financial reasons, the number of students in groups is higher than the optimal. Raising the number would further worsen the learning opportunities of the students.
 - c, At the Medical School – due to the costly instruction – it would not be fair to get into the costly practices “free/cheap” against the students who pay a high tuition fee (or in case of Hungarians, who are subsidized more by the tax payers).
 - d, At several practices (in patients’ wards, autopsy rooms, etc.) it would cause ethical and personal rights problems to have students who are not taking that course officially.

My latest memorandum only referred to the students who are officially taking the course in the ETR.

Please keep and make others keep the above.
